Amelia has been a popular and much valued member of the NYB team for 10 years, having assisted founder Jill Tookey and five subsequent Artistic Directors including Mikah Smilie, Drew McOnie, Ruth Brill, Carrie Johnson and most recently Louise Bennett (2022-2024) in the planning and delivery of *re | generation* (2022) and *Evolving Visions* (2023-2024).

Amelia O'Hara

Amelia (she/her) is a passionate and experienced classical ballet teacher, and former professional dancer, who is committed to ensuring that the next generation of young people have the opportunity to experience the joy and transformational power of dance. She

believes in creating positive and safe environments where young people can develop their artistic confidence, and advocates for wider access routes into the arts.

As a dancer, Amelia trained at The Royal Ballet School and Tring Park School for the Performing Arts, where she performed with The Royal Ballet Company and Northern Ballet Theatre. She went on to work and tour extensively with Scottish Ballet, Ballet Cymru, Peter Schaufuss Ballet Company and Ballet Ireland, as well as working with Arielle Smith, Drew McOnie, Jenna Lee and International Arts Collective for various productions worldwide.

After her successful career as a dancer, Amelia undertook the Royal Ballet School's Diploma of Dance Teaching and currently teaches for the Royal Ballet School's Associate programme in Manchester, and for Birmingham Royal Ballet's Dance Track department. She has also taught for multiple organisations including Ballet Boost, Ballet Ireland, ACE Dance and Music, English National Ballet's Youth Co, Elite Ballet Project, Laine Theatre Arts, and as Movement Rehearsal Director at Mountview for Arielle Smith.

Amelia first experienced NYB as a student, when she received a scholarship from Eve Pettinger MBE which enabled her to attend. This was where she met NYB's dynamic founder, Jill Tookey CBE, who would later invite Amelia to work with them whilst on her breaks from performing. This opportunity allowed Amelia to explore and develop another side to her work, and over the years her roles and responsibilities at NYB have grown. In 2022 she became the Associate Artistic Director and she is honoured to now become the Artistic Director for the Residential Performance Company 2024/2025.

Louise Bennett

Louise (she/her) is currently the Artistic Director of London Vocational Ballet School and was the Artistic Director of National Youth Ballet's Residential Performance Company from 2022-2024. She trained at The Royal Ballet School and danced with The Royal Swedish Ballet, Norwegian National Ballet and English National Ballet. After ending her performing career in 2016, she worked as a freelance ballet teacher, artistic director, rehearsal director, creative producer and choreographer based in London.

From 2020-2022, upon director Demis Volpi's invitation, she worked as a Ballet Master at Ballett am Rhein in Düsseldorf, Germany, working on creations and repertoire by choreographers including Demis Volpi, Sharon Eyal, Aszure Barton, José Limòn and Andrey Kaydanovskiy. She then returned to London to take up the post of Artistic Director of National Youth Ballet's Performance Company, working with a large creative team and 100 young dancers to produce mixed bills of new creations and NYB revivals, performing at Elmhurst Ballet School, The Crescent Theatre, and Sadler's Wells Theatre. Louise has taught ballet for companies including The Royal Ballet, English National Ballet, Ballett Zürich, Ballett am Rhein, Company Wayne McGregor, Ballet de l'Opéra du Rhin, Ballet Black, Rambert and Matthew Bourne's New Adventures, for students at Rambert School, London Vocational Ballet School, Laban, Zürich University of the Arts, and Balettakademien Stockholm, and as a ballet coach for early-career professionals at the Biennale College Danza in Venice.

Earlier this year she produced the project 'Performing Hope: Nature in the City', in collaboration with Climate Basecamp and Central School of Ballet, and she has worked as a personal coach for Francesca Hayward during several film shoots.

As a choreographer, Louise has created pieces for National Youth Ballet, The Royal Ballet School, Ballet Central, Encore Dance Company, Tivoli Ballet and Outside Edge Theatre Company, as well as winning the Kenneth MacMillan and Ninette de Valois choreographic awards while studying at The Royal Ballet School.
